BUGGINS	A pessimist who always sees the worst outcome of any situation.
SHALFORD	The owner of Shalford's Emporium. Stern, miserable, miserly and rarely has a good word to say about anything or anybody.
CHITTERLOW	An actor and Playwright he is a typical flamboyant thespian.
YOUNG WALSINGHAM	Helen's Brother. Inexperienced in business but manages to persuade Kipps to invest in one of his schemes.
ANN	Kipps' childhood sweetheart. Appears to be fairly quiet and demure but has a different side to her not seen very often. Capable of sticking up for herself and can have a bit of a temper.
FLO, VICTORIA, KATE and EMMA	Shopgirls at Shalford's Emporium. (I'd like to see auditionees bring their own characters to these parts)
HELEN WALSINGHAM	Upper class, educated, takes an interest in Kipps and gets engaged to him (Kipps doesn't quite know how that happens)
MRS WALSINGHAM	Helen's mother, upper class, doesn't really approve of Kipps or Helen's relationship with him.
LAURA	Bar maid. Flirty and outgoing.
JEREMIAH	Evening class student
